Frequently Asked Questions

How long is the experience?

The performance/walk lasts approximately 25 minutes.

Where does the performance take place?

The Forest Listens begins at the Huston-Brumbaugh Nature Center's visitors center and takes place along the Nature Center's boardwalk and improved surface trails.

Will I be walking during the performance?

Yes. Audience members will walk with a guide through the boardwalk area and stop at several performance locations along the route.

Is the boardwalk accessible?

The performance takes place on the Nature Center's newly remodeled boardwalk, which is ADA accessible. The boardwalk accommodates assistive mobility devices such as walkers, rollators, wheelchairs, power wheelchairs, or powered mobility scooters.

What should I wear?

Comfortable walking shoes and weather-appropriate clothing are recommended.

What happens if it rains?

Because the event will be held outside, a performance will be canceled in the event of inclement weather. We will work with attendees to re-book them for another performance if tickets are available. Ticketholders will be notified of any cancellations."

Are there restrooms available?

Yes, restrooms are available at the Visitors Center of the Huston-Brumbaugh Nature Center.

Can children attend?

The performance is suitable for all ages. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

Can I bring a stroller or wagon?

Yes, the boardwalk can accommodate small strollers or wagons. The boardwalk surface is 5 feet wide and can accommodate single-width strollers or wagons.

May I bring my dog?

While dogs are welcome on the boardwalk, we suggest leaving pets at home while you are at the performance.

How many people will be in each group?

Each group will include 10 attendees and will depart at scheduled intervals to provide an intimate experience.

When should I arrive?

Please arrive 10-15 minutes before your scheduled departure time.

Are tickets required even though the event is free?

Yes. Tickets are required because group sizes are limited.

Where can I park?

Parking is available in the main lot (concrete surface) and overflow lot (gravel surface) adjacent to Daniel Street as well as a small lot near the Visitors Center (gravel surface). Two handicapped parking spaces are available adjacent to the Visitors Center and two more are available in the concrete surface lot. Staff will be present to assist with available parking locations.
